#### **FUND RAISING UPDATE**

Nearly thirty years ago, many of you embarked on a historic effort – the establishment of a Jain Center in Metro Washington Area. By God's grace, our center has grown over the years, and we firmly believe our best days are ahead of us.

Now, we begin an ambitious dream of "Building Our Future Together." The Fund Raising (Capitol Campaign = Cash and Material goods) will fund the construction of a new 30,000 sq. ft. Jain Center to include everything we need. The Temple Committee has exercised good stewardship in planning for a total project cost that is estimated at \$10 million.

In an effort to achieve our goals, the Fund Raising team has identified several schemes. We need **donation of 8 – 10** hours of your time in next 6-8 weeks to develop detailed guidelines, identify recognition location options and marketing materials on each for mass distribution. As a start, following schemes has been identified with ambitious goals for each:

- Founder Member
- Legacy Fund Donation
- Lottery ticket sale to do Pratishtha
- Pathway to Moksha Bricks (various sizes)
- Marble tiles for temple wall (various sizes)
- Kalpa Vraksha (Tree of Life)
- Pillars of Strength (Woman & Men's Pillar)
- Various Rituals and Ceremonies (Pre-Pratishtha)

- Fixed Nakro/Bharai (guidelines, etc. done)
- Materials & goods donation from India
- Final Pratishtha
- Other

To sustain our new Center, we need \$180,000 annually, this is based on benchmarking data from centers & temples our size. We can raise this, as do others, by rental income, Memorial plaques, various regular rituals and ceremonies, annual events, etc. We raise over \$100,000 annually now.

#### **TEMPLE COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The schematic design for the new temple is complete. This includes all disciplines - Architectural, Civil, Structural, Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing. The Construction Committee visited the Architect's office in Richmond, Virginia.

The Geotechnical Study for the new temple is complete and the report is sent to the Architect, Civil and Structural Engineer for design of foundations.

The Temple schematic design is also completed by Rajesh Sompura. Schematic design is reviewed and approved by the Construction Committee and the Temple Committee. It will now be presented to the General Body for final approval, then we will ask Architect and Sompura to start Design Development stage.

The County hearing process with the neighbors will occur in the next couple of months with the assistance of our legal counsel. Following the county hearing process, as well as acceptance of building footprint and site layout, design team will proceed with the detailed design. Dead trees impacting the neighbors will be removed.

Volunteers are needed for finalizing Telecommunications, Security and Audio Visual requirements for the new facility. Please contact Arvind Shah or Ashok Shah at your earliest convenience.

#### TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

- New Website: As communicated in our previous newsletter, we have formed a team of volunteers who have come forward to help us revamp our current website using the latest technologies. This team has made significant progress in building several templates for the new website in an effort to ensure that the new website is mobile friendly while preserving the attractive looks that typically are available on a larger screen. The team has started migrating content to the new website, and are currently working on a requirement where the content is posted by one individual and approved by another individual before getting posted on the new website.
- **Domain Updates:** We are happy to report that we have regained complete access for the domain name <a href="www.JSMW.org">www.JSMW.org</a> that was used more than a decade ago. It is a fully functional domain name and our new website is currently being tested out at that domain address. Due to lack of adequate administrative information for the transfer of <a href="www.JainSocietyDC.com">www.JainSocietyDC.com</a> domain address, we will be moving away from using this domain. We plan to go live with <a href="www.JainSocietyDC.org">www.JSMW.org</a> domain addresses only and will send an email with detailed information as we get closer to the switch of domain names.
- **Software Updates:** After spending a lot of time in getting JSMW recognized as a not-for-profit organization with Microsoft, we are now approved to request and acquire almost any software from Microsoft and numerous other software vendors. As a result of this effort, we now have access to Microsoft Office 365, Skype for Business, MS-Visio to name a few. Our team has made significant progress in testing the tool and is currently in middle of implementing Skype for Business, our new platform of choice for all web conferencing needs.
- Hardware Updates: During the holiday season of 2015, we have purchased a high-end computer workstation, a Polycom conferencing phone system, a projector, and a scanner for our office needs at the Jain Center. Our goal is to digitize all paperwork, past invoices, past newsletters, and any other artifacts that is currently in hard copy format.
- **JSMW Cloud:** We have successfully setup JSMW Cloud (storing all files into remote machines allowing our officials to access those files from anywhere) and have setup various accounts for the Executive Committee, Trustees, Temple Committee, Construction Committee, etc. This will allow a smooth transition between outbound and incoming officials as well as ensure a seamless transfer of data between them (rather than depending on an electronic exchange of numerous files via email). The Temple Committee and our external partners (civil engineers and architects) are actively using JSMW Cloud accounts to store their drawings and large files.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

- We are currently in the process of migrating our accounting software and membership information in a newer version of Quick Books accounting software. As a result of this migration, we are not able to provide all donation records for this period. Please accept our deepest apologies for any inconvenience this may cause. We will provide a cumulative list of donation records in the next newsletter. In the meantime, if you have any questions or need additional information, please send us an email at Treasurer@JainSocietyDC.org any time.
- Earlier in February, we created an automated program using Visual Studio Framework that read all records from the financial database, and transmitted a donation receipt, via an email with a PDF file attachment, to all donors for their tax deductions purpose. This automation software was solely developed by Vishal Mehta, Secretary (Executive Committee). Thank you Vishalbhai for sharing your talents!


#### **DID YOU KNOW?**
