Swapna Ceremony Sunday, September 4

Pravachan and Swapna ceremony will be held at a school on Sunday, September 4. Pravachan in Gujarati will start at 1:30 p.m. Swapna ceremony will start at 2:30 p.m. During the Swapna ceremony, members will have the honor of carrying each Swapna to the beats of drums and music. First 10 Swapnas (except for the 4th Swapna – Lakshmi) will be pre-assigned for a donation of \$501 each. Please call Ashok/Pallavi Shah at 301-260-1264 if you wish to take any of these 9 Swapnas (#1-3 and #5-10) to be pre-assigned. This assignment will be done on a first come first served basis. Gheeboli will be performed for Lakshmi and other Swapnas that are not pre-assigned, and also for Parnu, Arti and Mangal Divo. Two or more families can join in Gheeboli or for the pre-assigned Swapnas.

The Swapna ceremony will be followed by Swami Vatsalya Bhojan sponsored by **Pravin and Rashmi Bhavsar in memory of their daughter Anila**. Such members as well as their guests and non-members can take part in the Swami Vatsalya Bhojan by donating a minimum of \$6.00 per person to the Swami Vatsalya fund.

For this program, we have requested Montgomery County to allow us to use the nearby Benjamin Banneker Middle School located at 14800 Perrywood Drive in Burtonsville, Maryland. The county has not yet confirmed our request. In case they allocate a different school, the change in location will be announced during Paryushan program, and will also be posted at our Jain Center and on our web site JainSocietyDC.org. Directions to the Banneker Middle School are given below.

FROM JAIN CENTER: Turn right on Briggs Chaney Road. Turn left at the third traffic light for Old Columbia Pike. Within 1 mile, turn left on Perrywood Drive. The school will be on your left.

FROM I-495: Take exit 30A for Route US 29 North. After 6 miles, turn left on the traffic light for Briggs Chaney Road West. Immediately, turn right on the traffic light for Old Columbia Pike. Within 1 mile, turn left on Perrywood Drive. The school will be on left.

FROM I-95: Take Exit 33B for Route MD 198 West to Burtonsville. After passing Route US 29, turn left on the first traffic light for Old Columbia Pike. After about 1 mile, turn right on Perrywood Drive. The school will be on your left.

Samvatsari Pratikraman Thursday, September 8

The Samvatsari Pratikraman in Prakrut/Gujarati will be held at a school. Samvatsari Pratikraman program will start at 4:00 p.m. sharp with Gheeboli for reciting Pratikraman Sutra. Pratikraman in Prakrut/Gujarati will start exactly at 4:30 p.m. To avoid causing any disturbance while the Pratikraman is in progress, all participants are requested to come early and be seated before 4:00 p.m., and please do not bring any children under the age of 8 years.

For this program, we have requested Montgomery County to allow us to use the Briggs Chaney Middle School located at 1901 Rainbow Drive, Burtonsville, MD 20866. The county has not yet confirmed our request. In case of any change in the location, the new location will be announced during Paryushan program, and will also be posted at our Jain Center and on our web site JainSocietyDC.org. Directions to the Briggs Chaney School are given below:

FROM JAIN CENTER: Turn right on Briggs Chaney Road. Turn left on the first traffic light for Good Hope Road. Drive about half a mile and turn right on the stop sign for Rainbow Drive. After ¼ mile, the school will be on your right.

FROM I-495: Take exit # 28A for New Hampshire Avenue North (Route MD 650 North). Drive about 5.5 miles and turn right on the traffic light for Good Hope Road (called Bonifant Road on the left side). Pass one traffic light (Briggs Chaney Road). Turn right on the stop sign for Rainbow Drive. After ½ mile, the school will be on your right.

FROM I-95: Take exit # 33B (Route MD 198 West) towards Burtonsville. After about 5 miles, turn left on Good Hope Road. Turn left on the stop sign for Rainbow Drive. After ½ mile, the school will be on your right.

Pratikraman in English will be held at the Jain Center from 6:30 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. on September 8. Children as well as parents are welcome to participate in this. Arti/Mangal Divo and Tapasvi Bahuman programs will be held at the Jain Center.

Das Lakshan Parva September 9 to 18

Dr. Ujjwalaben and Pandit Dineshbhai have kindly agreed to grace the Das Lakshan program this year. In addition to recognizing the Das Lakshan (ten virtues) during the 10-day period, we will have Pravachans in Hindi by these two learned scholars. They visited us in 2004 and their Pravachans were easy to understand and interesting, and benefited many of us who attended regularly. This year, Pandit Dineshbhai will cover the Jain Siddhant Praveshika from the most basic as well as advanced points of view. Dr. Ujjwalaben's Pravachans will be on Panch Labdhi. We will have multiple copies of the book 'Panch Labdhi' written by Dr. Ujjwalaben and 'Jain Laghu Siddhant Praveshika' so that we will have books in front of us during the Pravachans. The *tentative* schedule for their Pravachans, to be held every day from September 9 to 17 at the Jain Center, is as follows:

Afternoon Pravachans will cover Panch Labdhi and Jain Siddhant Praveshika. Evening Pravachans will cover the meaning of Das Lakshan and Jain geography.
