Your Board of Trustees is working very hard and diligently meeting regularly once every week to work on the Fund Raising details for the Temples and the New Jain Center. In the coming weeks, we will be able to release some important information about the Fund Raising program to the members of our Society.

The Temple Committee has been very busy working towards finalizing the set of drawings for the Temples, the Educational and Social wings of the future Jain Center. To that effect, a Special General Body Meeting held on Sunday, August 23, 2015 has approved the Temples' design, Murtis in the Temples, and the overall Jain Center design drawings submitted by the Sompura's and the Architect. This will allow the Temple Committee to proceed with the Civil Engineers and the Architect to start the permit process with the PG County.

The Executive Committee has organized several programs between now and December 31, 2015. Two of the main programs are celebration of Paryushan Parva beginning Thursday, September 10, 2015, and Das Lakshana Parva beginning Friday, September 18, 2015. Please participate actively in these religious activities including the Swapna Ceremony.

In the next few years we have a very big task of funding and building the new Shikharbandhi Temples and the Educational and Social wings of the New Jain Center. The Temple Committee, Construction Committee, Executive Committee and the Board of Trustees are working very actively to make that dream come true. A few members of these committees cannot do all the work by themselves. We need many more volunteers to help achieve our dream – the New Jain Center.

It is my humble request to you all to come forward and call upon any one of the Chairmen of the above named committees, or the President, or the Chairman of Trustees and offer your expertise and knowledge in achieving our ultimate goal. PROGRESS FOR THE NEW JAIN CENTER TEMPLE

The temple committee has been diligently working towards completing our dream of an authentic Jain temple for our society. After Mahavir Jayanti, the committee had displayed in the Temple three sets of plan drawings for the membership to provide comments and suggestions. After reviewing all the suggestions, they were given to the Architect to incorporate and come up with new two sets of drawings. The Temple Committee approved one design after carefully reviewing the two drawings. This design was on display at our temple from August 16-23 and was presented to our members at the Special General Body meeting held on August 23rd, 2015 for its review and approval. The Special General Body unanimously approved:

- The selection of Murtis for the temples,
- The layout of the temples, and
- The layout of the Jain center with educational, administrative and dining areas with future multipurpose hall.

Now that we have your approval, we will move forward with:

- Sharing our plans with the rest of the Jain Society Members,
- Submitting Storm Water and Sedimentation Control Management concept Plan for PG County's approval,

- Geotechnical Report by December 2015,
- Submitting preliminary site plan to PG County for their approval and neighborhood hearing,
- Sheela Ropan Ceremony during Spring-2016, and
- Tentative construction and Pratishtha during Fall-2017.

We have had another very busy and successful 2014-15 Pathshala year. We concluded with an annual picnic on the last day of Pathshala. Pathshala Year 2015-16 will begin from October 4th, 2015 for children between 3 years and 10th grade. It will be held on 1st, 3rd and 5th Sunday of every month (with exceptions) from September through June between 10:15 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. totaling 20 classes. Our Pathshala curriculum consists of 8 levels. Each student spends a minimum of 2 years in a class except Nursery, Pre-alpha and Class G which is for 1 year each. - Jain Youth Exchange Program: On Saturday, June 27th, a delegation of 12 JAIN youths arrived in Washington, D.C. for embarking a 4-day journey in and around the nation's capital. Starting with a stop at a local Cambodian Temple, they were welcomed at our Jain Center by our dedicated members. The youths participated in the darshan and pooja at the Jain Temple followed by a one-on-one meeting with Samniji (Parimal Pragyaji and Maryada Pragyaji). They visited Baltimore Inner Harbor, Washington monuments, U.S. Capitol, U.S. Department of State, Embassy of India, Library of Congress, and U.S. Chamber of Commerce. At the National Museum of Natural History, these youth experienced the groundbreaking exhibition "Beyond Bollywood" to explore the heritage, daily experience and diverse contributions that Indian immigrants have made in shaping the United States. They participated in an interfaith dialogue at the American Jewish Committee (AJC) in collaboration with the Hindu American Foundation (HAF) for a discussion on domestic and global advocacy as well as participate in a discussion revolving on United States-India economic and political relations from the U.S. perspective. After each day of travel, the youth met with local Indian-American youth and exchanged, compared and contrasted ideas and thoughts between their upbringing and culture in respect to Jainism. This meaningful interfaith dialogue was commented by His Eminence Jean-Louis Cardinal Tauran as well as other Catholic and Jain leaders. This event was a very carefully planned one that was witnessed by around 150 attendees. We have posted audio and video files on the Jain Society website. - <u>D.C. Kitchen:</u> On Saturday, May 16th, more than 50 volunteers have joined us for this community service project. Once again, JSMW volunteers prepared a vegetarian meal for approximately 4,500 needy people in DC-Metro area. This meant 4,500 individuals were served JAIN meals on this day (and not eating meat), ultimately saving the lives of countless animals (giving them Abhay Daan).
- <u>Mahavir Janma Kalyanak Program:</u> On Saturday, April 25th, we had a stage program that was the result of hard work and talent of our Pathshala children, their teachers and parents. On behalf of entire Executive Committee, we thank all participants, coordinators, teachers, parents and all the volunteers who put on hundreds of hours to make the entire stage program successful and one that exceeded our expectations in all respect!

PRATIKRAMAN: How to observe it?

Pratikraman is a time for us to meditate and reflect upon our soul, eradicate our soul of karma, and ask for forgiveness for any wrongdoings. It is recommended that one should perform Pratikraman once in the morning and once at night. Jain scriptures suggest Pratikraman every night. If that is not possible, it is advised to perform Pratikraman once every fortnight, or four months, or perform Samvatsari Pratikraman once a year (at minimum). Our ultimate goal is to free our soul from karmic bondage, and the longer we wait, the harder it is to get rid of our karma.

There are certain essential rules prior to performing Pratikraman: i) Take a bath, ii) Wear clean clothes, iii) Sit cross legged on a wooly cloth in a quiet place, iv) Have a Muhapatti (white clean handkerchief), v) Have a Navkarwali (Rosary) Navkarwali has 108 beads representing the following total 108 qualities:

Arihantas: 12 qualities
 Siddhas: 8 qualities
 Acharyas: 36 qualities
 Upadhyayas: 25 qualities
 Sadhus: 27 qualities

vi) Have a Charavala (Soft white brush), and viii) Before sitting down, examine the place for any tiny living creatures.

Pratikraman is divided into six essentials: 1) Samayik - a state of total equanimity, 2) Chauvisantho - worshipping the twenty-four Tirthankars, 3) Vandana - offering salutations to sadhus (monks) and sadhvis (nuns), 4) Pratikraman - realizing what we have done wrong and annotating on it, 5) Kayotsagga - meditation of the soul, and 6) Pratyakhyan - renunciation.

At the conclusion of six essentials, Laghu/Moti Shanti is recited. Shanti is a hymn of peace and well-being of all living beings. This Shanti is recited in the praise of Shantinath Bhagwan and other Tirthankars. The Pratikraman ritual is concluded with Kshamapana:

Khaamemi Savva Jeeva

I grant forgiveness to all living beings

Savve Jeeva Khamantu Me

May all living beings grant me forgiveness

Metti Me Savva Bhuesu

My friendship is with all living beings

Vairam Maiham Na Kenai

My enmity is totally non-existent

"Michchhami Dukkadam" are the two words of mutual exchange which are very important and recited throughout the Pratikraman. Everyone is expected to recite them. We fold our hands in front of us and recite "Michchhami Dukkadam" as we meet others. Michchhami Dukkadam means forgiving and asking to be forgiven for any misdeeds committed knowingly or unknowingly.
