The past few weeks have been highly engaging – the new temple site has been cleared up and is in full preparation for the Shilanyas Mahotsav on October 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>. JAINA was a success in many ways, as we got the opportunity to network and share details about Shilanyas and what's on the horizon with our new temple site. We saw members of our Sangh excel, enjoy, and enlighten themselves throughout the Convention. We highlighted our strength and energy, which was made even more evident with our high attendance. We are grateful for everybody's participation and dedication to our Sangh - this will help us grow even stronger during the new Pathshala year and as we focus on our new temple! Please continue your engagement and encourage others to do the same.

#### **NEW SHIKHARBANDHI TEMPLE AND JAIN CENTER CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

Site development work is progressing at a rapid speed! About 15% of work is already complete. Excavation for Shilanyas has started on August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019.

- A contract for site electrical work has been awarded and work will begin shortly this month.
- Installed 2600 feet of construction fence with two 20 feet gate completed in July.
- Third party inspection contract was awarded in May; inspection and testing work is underway for the site work construction.

As of today, our site contractor has made following progress:

- Installed the sediment and erosion controls including 4 gabion wire basket outfalls filled with 4" – 6" crushed stone to filter sediment laden water before it leaves the site.
- Installed several hundred feet of super silt fence and approximately 2,000 LF of earth dike on the perimeter to channel water.
- Completed clearing and grubbing of trees which involves removal of trees from approximately 5 acres of land. Roughly 200 trees were removed of all sizes including several over 48" in diameter.
- 7,200 cubic yards of topsoil stripped from the subgrade to be used later.
- Moved 5,500 CY out of the Sheela area to onsite structural compacted fills.
- We need to bring approximately 30,000 cubic yards (2,400 dump truck loads)
  of structural fill (soil) to level our site. Till now contractor has brought in
  approximately 3,000 cubic yards (250 dump truck loads) so far. Plan is to
  bring remaining soil by middle of August.
- We are planning to have half of the site ready for our use, including pavement, before Shilanyas and remaining site development work by end of year 2019.

If you are every in the area, please swing by the construction site and visualize our grand New Temple and Jain Center standing there in just a few years.

- 1. There are many apps to manage your podcasts. One that has worked well with the JSMW Podcast is Castbox. You can install it for free from the Google Play Store.
- 2. Once installed, Open the Castbox app. You can <u>Skip</u> the login, if you would prefer.
- 3. Once opening, it may ask you to subscribe. Unselect any podcasts that you don't want to subscribe to.
- 4. Once you have opened the app, at the top in Search bar, enter JSMW and our podcast will show up.
- 5. Tap to open the JSMW Podcast.
- 6. You will now notice the orange Subscribe button, as shown in the screenshot. Tap on it.

- 1. Open the Podcast app, which should already be on your phone.
- 2. Once you have opened the app, at the bottom right, locate the Search tab and tap on it.
- 3. In the search bar, type JSMW and press Search. It will show the JSMW Podcast icon as shown in the screenshot below. Tap on it.

#### Samvatsari Pratikraman

**Pratikraman** (lit. "introspection") is a ritual during which Jains repent (prayaschit) for their sins and non-meritorious activities committed knowingly or inadvertently during their daily life through thought, speech or action.



Pratikramana also refers to a combition of six avashyaks (essential rituals), being Samayik (state of total equanimity), Chauvisantho (honoring the 24 Tirthankars), Vandana – (offering salutations to sadhus (monks) and sadhvis (nuns)), Pratikramana (introspection and repentance), Kayotsarga (meditation of the soul) and Pratyakhyan (renunciation).





#### TAX EFFICIENT WAYS TO DONATE TO JSMW

#### 1. Receive a tax deduction with a cash gift:

Deduct up to 60% of your AGI if you itemize deductions. When cash gifts exceed this limit, carry over the excess donation for up to five additional years.

#### Various ways to make cash donation to JSMW:

#### 2. Donor-Advised Funds / The Giving Fund:

The donor may claim an immediate tax deduction for contributions made to the JSMW. You can contribute appreciated assets which would avoid capital gains. No tax reporting is required by the donor. You can fund JSMW on the timetable that best suits you.

#### 3. "Bunching" strategy:

This strategy will allow you to surpass the itemization threshold by bundling together your tax deductions into a single year and then take the standard deductions in interim years. This would require a careful and intentional timing of expenses you would like to deduct.

#### 4. Contributing appreciated securities:

This continues to be an invaluable tax strategy as donating highly appreciated assets can reduce your overall income tax liability, reduce capital gains tax and provide a larger donation to JSMW.

#### 5. Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD):

QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA to JSMW. This distribution from your IRA does count towards your required minimum distributions (RMD) for the year. The QCD excludes the amount donated from your taxable income. By reducing your taxable income, you may reduce the impact of certain tax credits and deductions, including Social Security and Medicare. You must be 70 ½ or older to be eligible to make QCD.

For making gift to JSMW using stocks/securities directly to JSMW account from your brokerage account you will need to provide following information to your financial institution.
