On Monday 21st to Friday 25th and on Sunday 27th, **Pravachans in Gujarati** will be held at Jain Center in the morning from 10:30 to noon, and in the evening from 8:15 to 9:45. Also, a **Pravachan for children in English** will be held from 2:00 p.m. to 3 p.m. on Sunday 27th at Jain Center. Evening Pravachans will be followed by Aarti. The programs for Saturday 26th and Monday 28th are given below.

Swapna Ceremony Saturday, August 26

The program will be held on Saturday 26th at White Oak Middle School. **Pravachan** in Gujarati will start at 2:30 p.m. **Swapna ceremony** will start at 3:30 p.m. During the Swapna ceremony, members will have the honor of carrying each Swapna to the beats of drums and

Mid Year Review Meeting

On Saturday July 8th, members of the Executive Committee and the Board of Trustees met at Ashok & Pallavi Shah's residence for working lunch. This meeting was also held as a Mid Year Review of how things were progressing and to brain storm ideas as to where we want to go now and how will we get there. The major points that came out of the meeting were:

General Guidelines for Sunday school

- 1. School Year The school year will start from 2nd Sunday of September and end on 4th Sunday of May (except otherwise stated).
- 2. Date/Time School will operate every 2nd and 4th Sunday (except otherwise stated) from 10.30 a.m. to 12 noon.
- 3. Age Limit Only children who are 6 years and above by December 31 are allowed to enroll.
- 4. Punctuality School timings are to be strictly followed. It is important that all children attend classes regularly and come to classes 10 min before time. Parents who drop off their children should arrive 10 minutes early and should pick their children after the school is over. Parents are encouraged to stay in the Temple premises and attend adult classes. The JSMW is not responsible for the children after the classes are over. Please note that:
 - If student is more than 10 minutes late, he/she will be given a tardy slip.
 - After 3 tardy slips, it will be considered 1 absence.
 - After 3 absences without informing the teacher in advance, student will be deregistered.
- 5. All parents must provide their emergency contact phone numbers.
- 6. Students are not to bring any other materials such as games, story books, drawing materials, non Pathshala school homework, etc. as these tend to be distractive.
- 7. Parents must inform teachers if their children are not able to attend a class.
- 8. Students who have not attended classes for a cumulative period of 3 sessions (without any valid reason) will be deregistered.
- 9. Annual Assessment Tests will be held in May on the last Sunday of the school. All registered students are required to take the tests.
- 10. Transportation All parents are responsible to drop off and pick up their children on time.
- 11. Both parents and children should keep our Temple premises clean and in good condition. Please ensure that items such as candy wrappers or snack bags are placed in the garbage can.
- 12. Volunteers run the Sunday school. Your participation in classroom activities is encouraged.
- 13. Complaints/suggestions in relation to Sunday school are to be made to the school coordinator for resolution.
- 14. Food, personal CDs or cassette players will not be allowed in the classroom areas during Sunday school hours.
- 15. Cancellation: Due to unavailability of teachers, volunteers, and lack of enrollment, or for any other reason; in worse case, individual classes may be cancelled or rescheduled without notice.
