
NEW TEMPLE & JAIN CENTER PROJECT UPDATE (AS OF 8/14/2021)

Construction Update

After signing the Construction Contract for the New Jain Center Building with DD&B Company on September 5th, 2020, CLIN 1 work is almost completed. CLIN 2 construction work in progress. General Contractor DD&B is ahead of construction schedule. FRP interior domes steel design work is already started.

Construction and Sitework

- Site work: Majority of the site work is complete. For easy access, there was a need to modify road configuration. Civil Engineer is working on the modification plan. It includes (1. Widening road in front of Derasar, and 2. Extending in the rear to provide circular pattern).
- CLIN 1 work: Foundation and slab on grade work is complete (including utilities below slab on grade).
- CLIN 2 work: Complete Derasar and Partial Jain Center Construction
 - o Partial "Notice to proceed" (NTP) is given to general contractor (DD&B). Based on that, Derasar concrete and CMU wall work is complete. Jain center super structure (columns. beams, roof structure and roof deck) is complete
 - Exterior and Interior wall framing is in progress.
- Due to Pandemic conditions, most of the construction materials are not easily available which resulted into shortage, price increase and schedule delays.
- Contractor (DD&B) is asking for price increase compensation, Temple committee chair (Arvind Shah) is negotiating with the contractor.
- JSMW need to select alternatives for the materials, which are not available or long lead items. e.g., Roof Insulation.
- Once Alternative materials are selected and price increase negotiation is complete, then JSMW to provide the NTP for remaining portion of CLIN 2 to complete rest of the work.
- Marble and FRP work are in progress.
- Shipping Team has been formed and in process of identifying various shipping companies, lead times etc.

- For example, the Policy Sub-Committee will outline rules around events hosted at the Temple, and the Process Sub-Committee will detail who to coordinate with, which forms to fill in, etc. Once we have a solid draft, we'll attempt to work with current and past EC members to validate the processes.
- Team will attempt to take the society's existing processes, document and improve them.
- In the past quarter, the team has continued to work on processes for Rituals and Events.

- Committee reviewed and evaluated various bids and finalized the vendor "Clear Connection"

- Clear connection will provide DD&B a copy of the layout drawing with all details.

PARTNERING WITH NIH - ALL OF US RESEARCH PROGRAM



The future of health begins with you.





In the past, medical research has left out many different groups of people. When you're not included in the research, you may be left out of the cures. The *All of Us* Research Program is building one of the most diverse health databases so researchers can work to understand the health needs of different communities. One project using data from *All of Us* is studying chronic disease health disparities in Asian American populations. The researcher is looking to reveal how these different communities have their own unique health needs that can be overlooked when grouped together as "Asian American".

You may already be aware that JSMW began our partnership with the *All of Us* Research Program in January 2021. This unique research program from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) has a goal to reach one million or more people historically underrepresented in medical research. JSMW has successfully renewed our contract with the *All of Us* Research Program (July 2021-June 2022). Under this contract, JSMW will continue to educate and encourage its members to register for the Research Program. NIH will fund JSMW to promote the program.

Early this year, we educated our members on how the *All of Us* Research Program relates to us as a South Asian, vegetarian demographic. We shared details on what the program is about and how/why to join. In May, we organized a webinar with Dr. Irene Prabhu Das who provided background on the program and how JSMW adds to its goal of creating one of the most diverse databases in history. We surely missed the in-person exchange on the topic, but our members still got excited about the opportunity to represent our community in this special research program and began registering!

At the recent JAINA convention, JSMW sponsored a large booth. This was a special convention where every program and booth were virtual. At our booth, we promoted and shared information about the New Temple Labhs and the *All of Us* Research Program.

This contractual year, JSMW will continue to educate and promote the *All of Us* Research Program. We plan to take a few minutes in Swapna Ceremony/ Das Lakshan to announce our partnership renewal. You will see lots of materials shared via our Facebook, WhatsApp, and email channels. We are looking for a few in-person reach outs during the Health Fair and Guest Speaker webinars. JSMW also plans to organize an Interfaith event in early 2022 with the Love Thy Neighbor organization and engage their audience as they bring diversity to the pool as well.



What is the All of Us Research Program?

The *All of Us* Research Program is a historic effort to build one of the largest and most diverse databases of health information that researchers can use to study health and look to improve ways to diagnose, prevent, and treat health conditions. The program wants to enroll one million or more people that reflect the diversity of America to help medical research represent all different communities.
