NEW TEMPLE & JAIN CENTER PROJECT UPDATE (AS OF 2/3/2023)

Construction of our New Jain Center in next nine months will be very critical. In addition to DD&B building construction work, Marble and FRP installation will be in full swing. Marble carving, Wooden Doors, Paat, and shipping of marble/FRP from India is going on in full swing with progressive updates each week. Each day passing, we are coming closer to Pratishtha Mahotsav.

Thank you to the entire Temple Committee and various sub-committees for their hard work and dedication. Let us all continue to work together to make our dreams turn into reality. Detailed report is as follows:

Construction and Sitework:

- Under DD & B, the Drywall work for wall and ceiling is ongoing. Paint on walls and ceiling will follow once the drywall work is complete.
- The remaining electrical and mechanical work is in progress and is scheduled to be completed in the next 3 to 4 months.
- Material for floor finishing (LVT, tiles etc.) will be ordered by JSMW and installed under a separate contract.
- The A/V committee is working with an A/V contractor to take care of the remaining A/V work.
- Six FRP domes were installed and some of the FRP Chhajjas are also installed. Two FRP domes will be installed in the next two weeks. Remaining FRP material is ready (in India) and will be shipped soon.

- FRP Manufacturer visited our new temple site. He inspected all FRP work and provided valuable guidance regarding quality control work.
- Finishing: Team has worked on finalizing various finishes and will continue to review the in-lay designs.
- Shipping: 9 Containers for marble work have been received and all materials are installed on walls and Shikhars.
- Container #10 arrived on Feb 9th and Container 11th is expected to arrive March 17th at Baltimore port.
- Sitework: Once the building work is complete, remaining site work and additional road work (design to complete circular road) will take place.
- Time duration for original sitework contract is expired, so there will be cost increase to complete the remaining sitework.

Finance:

Reviewed and approved 50+ invoices from various contractors totaling \$2,500,000. Keeping log of account payable for each contractor. The current financial picture is summarized below as of December 31, 2022, for awarded contracts.

Policy Sub-Committee:

The Policy Sub-Committee has prepared Initial Draft Policy Documents for (a) Facility Usage and Renting Policy, (b) Performing Pooja and other Rituals, (c) Food Policy, (d) Visiting Scholars and (e) Education Policy. Received feedback on their Initial Draft Education Policy from Education Directors & some teachers, revised the draft based on their feedback, sent the revised version to them, and are awaiting their feedback.

Process Sub-Committee:

The Process Sub-Committee has completed 3 drafts (Communication, Facility Utilization and Passing of a Member), for formal submission to the Temple Committee, and is pending the Committee's approval for formal submission to the EC and BOT. Documentation is arduous work, and most volunteers have other commitments with JSMW. The group has stopped its efforts and has recommended reallocating the function elsewhere.

AV Sub Committee:

The A/V technology subcommittee had several meetings with Clear Connection and DD&B to finalize the low voltage requirements/changes and schedules. Cable Run is completed for Phase 1. Laid CAT6 cables for Data Network and Audio/Video. Laid Access Control and Alarm Control System cables.

If you are ever in the area, please swing by the construction site and visualize our grand New Temple and Jain Center installed there in just a few years.

PRATISHTHA UPDATE

We are very close to achieving our dream of building a world-class Shikharbandi Derasar & associated building complex (Jain Center) in the suburb of Nation's Capital.

Many of us are tirelessly working countless hours every week to complete Phase 1 which includes the Derasars, Upashray, Sthanak, Library, Office, two classrooms, and other required facilities.

There is delay in the delivery of carved Marble, which in turn impacts getting of the occupancy permit and pending Mahurat from Maharaj Saheb, Pratishtha dates in 2024 is TBD. We still have a lot of preliminary/preparatory work to complete for a successful and auspicious Grand Pratishtha Mahotsav.

In 2022, Pratishtha Core Team was established that has started working in earnest and meets every other Wednesday. The Pratishtha Core Team has planned over 27 Teams (a complete list can be viewed at www.jsmw.org/pratishtha) and is now seeking many subject matter expert volunteers and other volunteers to work towards our common goal of successfully completing the Grand Pratishtha Mahotsav. The commitment for most of the volunteers will be until completion of the Grand Pratishtha Mahotsav and for some it may be a few more months thereafter.

The past 12 months have been quite active for the new temple fundraising team, starting with MJK event followed by Bharaai & Takana Vidhi (Ahmedabad), Paryushan parva, followed by Anjan Shalaka event again in Ahmedabad. Each event was financially rewarding and met or exceeded our expectations for pledges and collection. Our team including members in India worked very hard to make each event a grand success and put JSMW on a Global platform for others to emulate.


The Shankheshwar Parshwanath Temple, Adinath Temple, and Sthanak teams have been researching and meeting frequently to plan detailed logistics, rituals, murtis/patts, and all the related processes for events in India and the USA.

In recent days, Sushil Jain visited Jaipur to meet with Adinath temple murti and parikar consultants and designers to finalize options. Thereafter visited Makrana to speak with our Marble fabricator to enhance communications and identified challenges with proposed solutions, and Indore to meet with possible host Sangh members for the upcoming Adinath Bhagwan Panch Kalyanak to be held in late April/early May under the guidance of 108 Munishri Aditya Sagarji Maharaj. Sushil Jain, his wife Asha Jain, and Kushal bhai Bhansali's family went on a 2-day trip to Sanchore and Virayatan school and temple opening as well as Hadecha temple project. Virayatan temple collected over 6 crores, Sanchore temple collected over 123 crores in 4 days with only 400 families and nearly 200 crores in Hadecha. Many of our trustees and supporters were there. He spoke to everyone and invited them to our Pratishtha ceremony. More recently on February 13th, Sushil Jain went to meet with Pujya Padmasagar Surishwarji MS in Daman for a day trip to request help with dev dravya funds as well as requested muhurat for our Pratishtha in Washington. On 14 Feb in AM Sushil Jain plans to meet with Naya Padmasagar Surishwarji MS in Mumbai.

As you can imagine, it takes many hours to do the planning, execution, and follow-up on these events. For those who have stepped up, and the list is long, Khub Khub Anumodana for your support. Our next step is to collect pledges as soon as possible to ensure our quest of our dream is not challenged for financial reasons.

JSMW speaker series

The Pathshala Speaker Series is aimed at our Parents, and covers a variety of topics, including Health, Financial, Lifestyle, College, etc. From September to January, we hosted 4 sessions:

October 30, 2022 - Caregiver Stress in Asian American Communities - Phoebe Shih from Asian American Health Initiative (AAHI)

Over 40% of Maryland's Asian Americans live in Montgomery County and 25% of those are of Indian descent. Compared to other minority groups, Asian Americans have the largest proportion of older adults, with 17.2% of Asian Americans being over the age of 65 years. More than 1 in 4 Asian Americans aged 65 years or older have a disability. With the increase in the number of Asian American older adults, the need for caregiver support will also increase. However, taking care of someone while managing jobs, kids, and daily chores is not easy. It can build a lot of stress on the caregiver in the long run.

November 20, 2022 – Estate and Financial Planning - Mrs. Veena Gandhi (Chicago)

Veena is on a mission to create financial literacy for 30 million families by 2030. Her organization provides free virtual lessons on these topics several times a week and you can be added to her list by emailing veenagandhi1@gmail.com

Key take-aways include:

- Health care premiums per couple after retirement can be as high as \$285,000
- Should you need long term care (something that 70% of people age 65+ need) there could be an additional yearly cost \$83,000, which Medicare won't cover.
- Noting that just a few of the 50+ audience members had wills, she encouraged everyone to update their planning documents (wills, trusts, power of attorney, etc.), in addition to ensuring beneficiaries on all assets (financial, property, etc.) are updated, especially as family situations evolve.
- Encourage families to communicate / discuss intentions to avoid future problems.
- To maintain your lifestyle, factor of 20 should be planned for retirement savings (20 x your yearly income)

December 4th, 2022 - Dental Hygiene - Dr. Sangita Doshi, a pediatric dentist

Dental caries is an infectious and transmissible disease primarily caused by streptococci mutans (a bacterial strain). More than 40% of kids have cavities by the age of 5. Here are some key takeaways to help prevent cavities and promote good oral hygiene.

Key take-aways include:

- Visit the dentist every 3-6 months.
- Use fluoride toothpaste. Lack of fluoride in drinking water (such as well water) or toothpaste can lead to cavities. The fluoride in toothpaste protects to keep the enamel (a protective covering on the teeth) intact.
- Dilute fruit juices by adding water to the juice This will minimize the sugar in the drink, protecting the enamel
- Avoid fruit snacks and/or gummies. Eat fruit or veggies after the snack to minimize the sugar sticking to the teeth. These are considered "brushing foods."

- For children aged 1 and up, straw cups are preferred. The use of sippy cups and/or feeding bottles should be minimized to protect the enamel.
- American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) recommends parents should help kids until the age of 9 years with brushing and daily flossing to help prevent cavities.

December 4th - All of Us Research Initiative - Information Session

The second session on December 4, 2022, was organized with the All of Us Research Program team. The All of Us (AoU) Research Program, spanning 10 years, is part of an effort to advance individualized health care by enrolling one million or more participants to contribute their health data over many years. The program aims to reflect the diversity of the United States and to include participants from groups that have been underrepresented in health research in the past. Participation is voluntary. Eligible JSMW members are encouraged to participate in this important program. For more information, please visit the AoU website.

January 8, 2023 - Giving and Receiving Feedback - Virtual session by: Mrs. Priti Shah (Michigan)

JSMW hosted Mrs. Priti Shah who lives in Michigan. Priti's interactive and engaging workshop founded on Jain principles of Anekantvad, Kashayas, Ratnatraya, and Panch Anuvratas has been widely popular throughout the Fortune 100 company she's been working in for over 11 years. She shared with us on how often we must give or receive feedback at the workplace or other environments and what if we feel the feedback provided lacks credibility, has faulty information, or their advice will do us more harm than good? Priti highlighted that feedback may not always be tactful or constructive, but with the right tools, we can empower ourselves to receive information and expand on our ability to be inclusive of others' perceptions of ourselves.

February 5, 2023 – Use of All of Us Research Data with Hiral Master and Dr. Irene Das

This event highlighted the All of Us Research Program, the important health research conducted using All of Us data, and how to increase South Asian representation in research. The discussion featured Irene Prabhu Das, PhD, MPH, Director of Regional Enrollment in the Division of Cohort Development in the All of Us Research Program with a background in cancer prevention research and public health, and Hiral Master, PT, PhD, MPH, Senior Scientific Project Manager at Vanderbilt University Medical Center whose research uses All of Us data to study the link between physical activity and chronic disease.

Future Jain Leadership Program (FJLP)

Future Jain Leadership Program (FJLP) is committed to developing Jain leadership by providing Jain youth with entrepreneurial education, leadership opportunities, and mentorship services, helping them create, deliver, and amplify value from new ideas, regardless of their future career path. FJLP is an initiative of the Jain International Trade Organization (JITO USA) which was founded in 2007 in India as a global organization made up of visionary Jain industrialists, businesspersons, and professionals.

FJLP envisions helping Jain youth define their life mission in alignment with JITO's principles, including economic empowerment, knowledge, and service. FJLP started its pilot year in the San Francisco Bay Area, soon expanding to Southern California. FJLP is rapidly growing with 1-2 new chapters every 6 months. FJLP also launched chapters in New York/New Jersey and Chicago in early 2021 and launched in DC in late 2021.




We understand that health research has left many communities out in the past. All of Us is committed to including everyone so that all communities can one day benefit from our research learnings.

As researchers study our health data, they start to see patterns. These patterns can help us understand how different people react to different prevention and treatment plans. We hope that, in the future, our findings will help health care providers deliver treatments that are tailored to our differences.

Get health information that matters to you, including DNA results, at no cost.

When you join, you can get information about yourself, like your weight and blood pressure. In the future, you can choose to receive your genetic results along with guidance on what it means. Your results may tell you about your risk for certain diseases or how your body responds to certain medications. Information about your DNA may help you and your health care providers make health decisions that are better informed and as unique as you are.


